The Domestic Violence Restraining Order is used to protect you or your children under the age of 18 who live with you from violence or threat of violence. The violence or threats must come from someone in your family or in your home or with whom you have a close relationship (i.e., spouse, parent, child, boyfriend, girlfriend). A Domestic Violence Restraining Order is used to stop a specific act against you, keep a specific person away from you, have someone living with you removed out of your home, and other miscellaneous orders (i.e., temporary child custody, child visitation, child support, property control). To Obtain a Restraining Order (In Stanislaus County) obtain a packet from the Modesto Court office or www.stanct.org. Other programs available, but not located in Turlock include Early Intervention, Mental Health Consultation Services for children 0-6, Home Based Services, various Family Education Programs, Family Maintenance and Reunification, an Employee Assistance program available for employers, Divorce Adjustment Counseling, and Health Related Counseling. Sierra Vista also operates a substance abuse program for pregnant and post partum women, other non-public schools for therapeutic and mental health needs children. Services are available either at no charge, through Stanislaus County Medi-Cal, or on a sliding scale.
