## SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers were very busy in their self-initiated activity. Graveyard officers made several arrests outside of calls for service. Some of the arrests were mentioned on the swing shift log. One incident highly worth mentioning is an officer located a vehicle that hit on the LPR system as a suspect vehicle in an out of county burglary. The theft involved over \$150,000 worth of Snap On tools from a commercial truck. The vehicle was stopped on Hwy 99 and the driver gave a false name to the officer. His true identity was eventually determined and it was found he had an active Ramey warrant out of Modesto. He was also found in possession of the stolen Snap On tools and a large amount of psilocybin mushrooms. He was arrested and booked on several different charges, along with the warrant.
