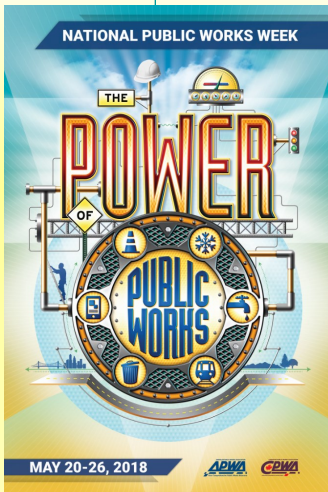

CELEBRATE PUBLIC WORKS WEEK MAY 21ST ~ 24TH

The City of Turlock, in conjunction with the American Public Works Association, will celebrate “National Public Works Week” from May 20th- 26th this year. The week serves to recognize those who work in professions that provide and maintain the vital infrastructure and services collectively known as public works. An equipment show and refreshments will be served outside of City Hall on Tuesday, May 22nd from 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm, prior to the City Council meeting, where a proclamation will be read to recognize the contributions of public works professionals to the Turlock community.



Public works professionals include those who design, manage, and maintain water, sewer, and storm water systems as well as those responsible for maintaining streets, street lights, traffic signals, public buildings, solid waste collection, parks and grounds. They are the people who maintain and improve the systems and services vital to a community’s health, safety and comfort. They also provide support and mitigation during natural and man-made disasters, and are frequently the first to respond and the last to leave.

WATERING LIMITED TO TWO (2) DAYS PER WEEK

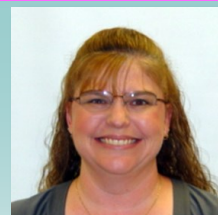
SUMMER WATERING SCHEDULE

MARCH 1ST TO OCTOBER 31ST

The City’s current watering schedule limits watering to two (2) days per week only. Addresses that end with an ODD number may water on Wednesday and Sunday. Addresses ending in an EVEN number may water on Tuesday and Saturday. Watering is prohibited from 9:00am to 7:00pm daily. For more information on the

THE BLUE CART IS FOR CLEAN RECYCLABLES ONLY!

Have you ever slipped a greasy pizza box into your blue bin because the black one is already full? Nobody noticed, right? Think again. A recent audit by the facility that processes Turlock’s recyclables indicated the level of contamination found within the blue carts exceeds industry standards and therefore can’t be recycled. Turlock Scavenger

currently provides residential pick-up service through a “three cart” waste collection system that provides for the collection of solid waste (black cart), commingled recyclables (blue cart), and green waste (green cart). All materials collected by Turlock Scavenger are processed through preliminary sorting with the blue cart recyclables

outsourced to a facility for enhanced sorting and recycling. Citizens are encouraged to **Recycle Clean - Keep Turlock Green** by not contaminating the recyclables in their blue cart. For more info on what items can go in the blue cart, visit the City’s website at CityofTurlock.org
