2. Community Academy 2018—Every Thursday evening, September 6 through November 15, community members who are part of the Community Academy meet to learn about the police department, its procedures, programs, and relationship with the Turlock community. The participants graduated on 11/15/18.
3. Halloween Trick-or-Treat at TPD and PAL Booth Downtown—On Halloween, Crime Prevention and VIPS handed out candy and welcomed children and their families as they trick-or-treated at TPD! The Chief and Lt. Cervenka were also downtown handing out candy for trick-or-treaters at the Police Activities League (PAL) booth.
4. Mayor's Youth Conference 2018—Students that were part of the Mayor's Youth Conference experienced a portion of their day at the Public Safety Facility. A K9 demonstration was given, students were allowed to view patrol vehicles, the SWAT truck and a traffic motorcycle, and ask officers one-on-one questions.

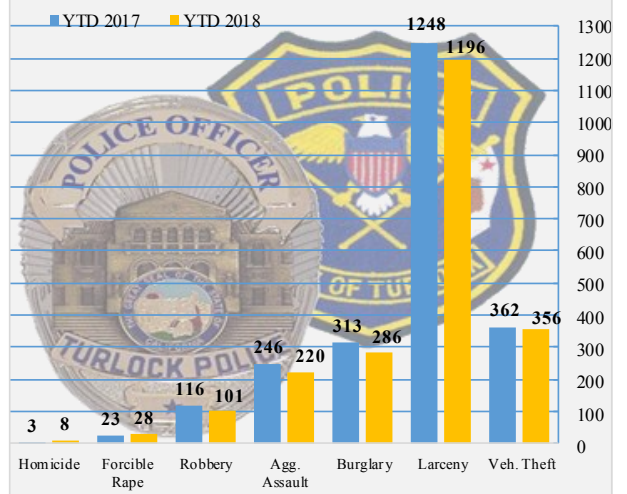

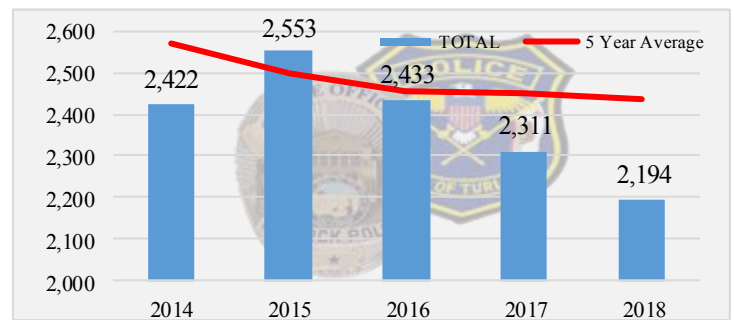
Part One Crimes YTD 2018 vs YTD 2017

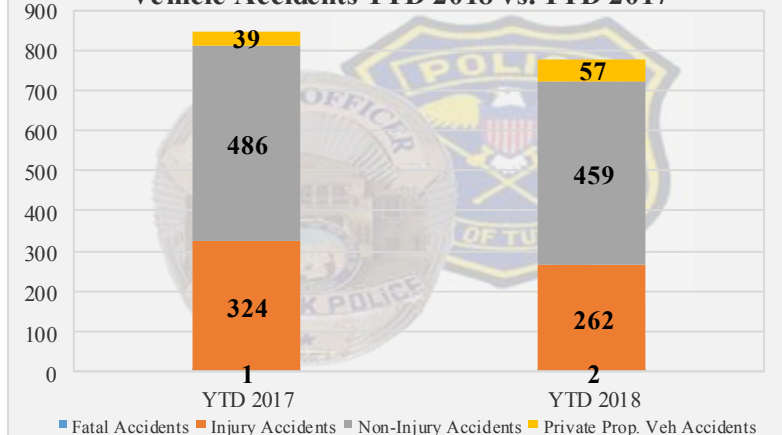
